6. Currency

 The currency is the South African Rand. You can only use this currency as legal tender, there is the possibility to exchange currency at the airport or near the hotel if necessary.



7. Safety Precautions

- South Africa has a high level of crime, however the risk of violent crime to visitors travelling to the main tourist destinations is generally low. The hotel is a very safe and modern place with strict security.
- The South African authorities give high priority to protecting tourists and tourism police are deployed in several large towns.

9. COVID-19 Regulations to enter South Africa.

- As at date, South Africa is open to all nationals in Africa. Fully Vaccinated travellers who have administered a vaccine recognized by the World Health Organisation (WHO), will NOT be required to produce a negative PCR test on arrival in South Africa.
- If you are not vaccinated or partly vaccinated, you will have to present a negative PCR test, on arrival in South Africa.
